

# **In Loving Memory**

It is with sad news that long time Knox member **Ernie Hutchinson** passed away peacefully on July 27th, 2023, in Victoria, BC, after several weeks of deteriorating health. He was born in Calgary on April 12, 1927. At Knox United, Ernie volunteered his time as a Trustee, a member of the Ministry & Personnel Committee, and also shared his legal expertise as he served on the committee that sold the air rights to Knox. He is survived by his wife Doreen.

# The following is an excerpt taken from Ernest Hutchinson's obituary published online by *The Times Colonist from Aug. 4 to Aug. 6, 2023.*

Ernie enjoyed a long and distinguished legal career. After graduation in 1952 from the University of Alberta with a degree in law, he joined the firm of Porter Allen & MacKimmie (later MacKimmie Matthews) in Calgary, where he practised for 32 years. He was closely involved with the Calgary branch

of the Canadian Bar Association and the Law Society of Alberta, serving terms as President with both. In 1985, Ernie was appointed to the Court of Queen's Bench of Alberta, where he sat until the mandatory retirement age of 75. He particularly enjoyed the camaraderie of his fellow judges.

For many years Ernie and Doreen had a seaside home in the North Saanich area of Vancouver Island. They made the island their full-time home in 1999, and moved to Victoria's Berwick Royal Oak retirement community in 2021.

Ernie was a man of integrity, compassion, and wit. He died with his clarity and sense of humour intact, and expressing his usual concern for others. His final words were "I love you. Cheer up!" We will cherish his memory.

## ♥ MUSIC NOTES: Today's music selections reflect the sermon theme "choosing the wild."

The hymns speak about facing adventure and challenge (I Feel the Winds of God Today), encountering and appreciating the vastness and variety of nature (Each Blade of Grass), and finding faith and God's presence on the roads we travel (Bless Now, O God, the Journey).

The titles of the instrumental music all have a "mountain" in the title.

- I. The prelude, "Grouse Mountain Lullaby" is by Canadian composer Stephen Chatman, and spotlights the famous mountain on the north side of Vancouver, which is a welcomes adventurers, and is also home to a wildlife refuge. The top of the mountain offers views of the Vancouver cityscape, the Douglas firs covering the mountainside, neighbouring peaks, the Pacific Ocean, inlets, bays, and the Gulf Islands.
- II. The candlelighting music, "Mountains and Hills," is a movement from the suite "Let the Earth Celebrate the Lord," by Canadian (Ottawa) award-winning composer, Rachel Laurin. The music is mysterious and expansive. ♥ Rachel is living with stage 4 cancer − please keep her in your prayers.
- III. The postlude, "Pisgah" פְּסְנָּה is a Hebrew word in the Bible that literally means "summit." In the Book of Deuteronomy, God tells Moses to stand atop Mount Pisgah to see the Promised Land. This region lies east of the Jordan River and northeast of the Dead Sea. In the context of this music, Pisgah was the name given to this American folk hymn melody, first published in the *Sacred Harp*, 1859. The melody is set to interesting rhythms and harmonies by American composer Dale Wood.


