MUSIC NOTES

TODAY Kirkin' of the Tartans - We welcome the St. Andrew-Caledonian Pipers (Robert Henderson, director), and Choir (Beth Ann Friesen, director), who bring to Knox the celebration of Scottish heritage in North America: "The Kirkin' of the Tartans" or **blessing the tartans.**

The music today celebrates Scottish and Gaelic traditions, all families, belonging, Pride Month, and the parable of the Mustard Seed.

This morning, we sang two 'heritage' hymns with familiar tunes, but fitted with new, thoughtful, and inspiring words about love, families, and belonging. They were sourced from a **new hymnal called Songs for the Holy Other** designed by the Hymn Society of the USA and Canada, and introduced to Knox by Keith Murray, our seminary intern. This hymnal is a welcome and exciting addition to Knox's repertoire of congregational music and encourages us to "Sing a New [and Inclusive] Song." Included below is the Project Description of this ground-breaking hymnal, in the words of its creators:

"Songs for the Holy Other aims to provide congregations, working to dismantle these walls, with a toolbox of hymns by and for those who identify as members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, pansexual, transgender, nonbinary, queer, questioning, intersex, asexual, aromantic, two-spirit, and other sexual/gender minority (LGBTQIA2S+) community and their allies. For many members of the LGBTQIA2S+ community, assimilation is not an option; we continue to be othered for our identities, relationship-styles, dis/abilities, race, economic status, and more. The title, Songs for the Holy Other is a self-conscious claiming of otherness as holy and beloved of God. We who have been labeled as "wholly other" are claiming our holiness, and reclaiming our otherness as a prophetic witness to the church.

The gifts God has given us are not in spite of our otherness, our queerness, our LGBTQIA2S+ identities, but rather our identities are inextricably tied up in our God-given gifts, and are, in and of themselves, a gift to the church, as we reflect the rainbow diversity of God's creation."

WEEKLY New Sermon Series: Short Stories by Jesus

Starting June 4, for six weeks, our themes and reflections will draw heavily from scholar Amy-Jill Levine and her book, "Short Stories by Jesus." Amy-Jill Levine is Rabbi Stanley M. Kessler Distinguished Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Hartford International University for Religion and Peace.
